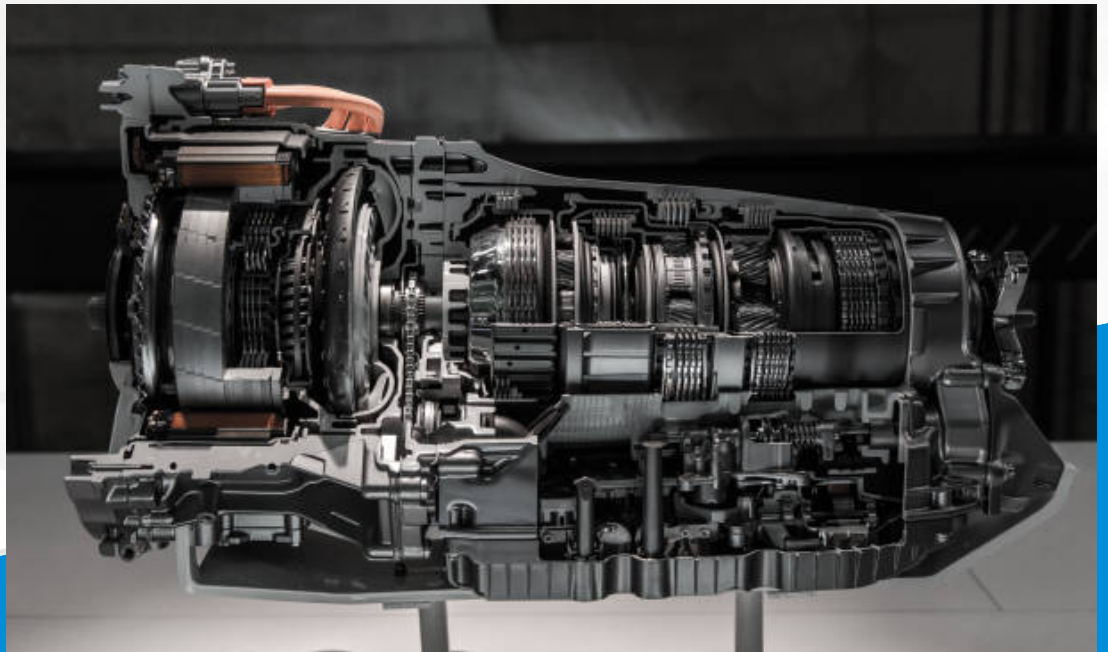


User-Manual: GUIDE FOR USED TRANSMISSION SALE



Know What You Need

First thing, figure out the exact transmission your car takes. Different models even in the same year can use different types. Look in the owner's manual, check the tag on your old transmission, or just ask a trusted mechanic. If you don't do this, you might waste cash buying the wrong one.



Check Out Sellers

Don't buy from the first place you see. Compare junkyards, auto part shops, and online sellers. Some people sell cheap but with no warranty, and that can be risky. Better to pay a bit more and know the seller has a good name.

Inspect Before Buying

When possible, look at the part with your own eyes. Check for oil leaks, broken bolts, rust, or cracks. Ask the seller how many miles it's been driven and why it was removed from the car.



Look at the Billing

This is important. Always ask for a proper bill or receipt. It should have part details, warranty, maybe even return policy. If the seller only wants cash and no paperwork, that's a big red flag.

Close the Deal Smart

Once everything looks fine, go ahead and buy. Keep your bill and warranty papers safe. If something goes wrong later, you will need them.
